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Certificate II in Construction Pathways

Pathway

Successful completion of this course will provide students with the practical skills and knowledge that will support further studies and future employment opportunities in the building and construction industry.

This qualification provides an introduction to the construction industry, its culture, essential occupational health and safety requirements, the industrial and work organization structure, communication skills, work planning and basic use of tools and materials. The qualification integrates and embeds employability skills.

The qualification provides a pathway to the primary trades in the construction industry with the exception of plumbing. Trade outcomes are predominantly achieved through an Australian Apprenticeship and this Certificate II allows for inclusion of skills suited for entry to off-site occupations such as joinery and shopfitting as well as carpentry, bricklaying and other occupations in general construction.

This Certificate II is designed to introduce learners to the recognized trade callings in the construction industry and provide meaningful credit in a construction industry Australian Apprenticeship.

The construction industry strongly affirms that training and assessment leading to recognition of skills must be undertaken in a real or very closely simulated workplace environment, this qualification requires all units of competency to be delivered in this context. A period of work placement is strongly recommended to ensure training outcomes are met.

Special requirements

In order to successfully complete the course, Students must make a commitment to attend ALL training and complete all work required, both practical and theory.

Students must adhere to all safety requirements as directed by their trainer. The approved GJTTC uniform and PPE will be required during all training

Students will be provided at no extra cost a high visibility shirt, work jumper and safety glasses.
